

Essential Teachers notes:

In order to remove this story from the fairytale like 'Jack and the beanstalk' this story is not written from the perspective of David but from the perspective of Goliath, and it's Goliath who is our hero. A hero does not need to be the goodie in the story, but he does need to teach us.

## Main Passage : 1 Samuel 17

Today's story is set on a battle field. Two armies were camping on opposite hills where they could see each other. On one side were the Israelite's and on the other side were the Philistine's. They both knew if the battle started many many men would die

In the philistine camp they came up with a plan. Everyone in the Philistine army knew about Goliath, Goliath could fight instead of them. Goliath was really really big. His legs were long and thick like tree trunks, his arms were wide and strong, and he was twice as tall as some other soldiers. His armour and javelin was so heavy some men couldn't lift it. Even his friends were a little scared of him. Goliath believed he was so big and strong nothing could hurt him.

The plan was that each army could send their best fighter and whoever won the fight would win the war. The losing side would become slaves. When Goliath looked at all the small week soldiers in the army, he was sure that the Israelite army wouldn't have anyone stronger, so he agreed to the plan.

Goliath and the person who carried his shield went down into the valley. Goliath took a deep breath and shouted the plan to the Israelite army. His voice echoed off the hills. Then he looked at the Israelite army and waited. Even though they were a long way off he could see they were scared, nobody came out to fight him. Eventually Goliath got bored, he kicked the man carrying his shield and they went back to the camp laughing. The next day Goliath went back down the hill with his shield man and shouted the challenge, again nobody came. "You come against me with sword and spear and javelin, but I come against you in the name of the Lord Almighty, the God of the armies of Israel.
